

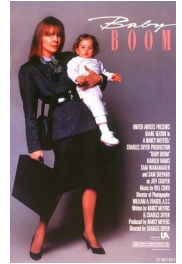


## Monday at the Movies!

### Monday January 15, Shotmeyer Room, 2 pm:

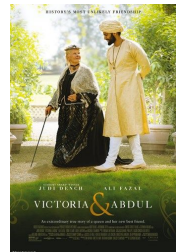
