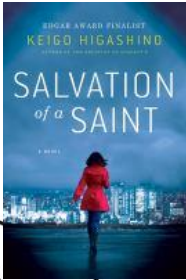

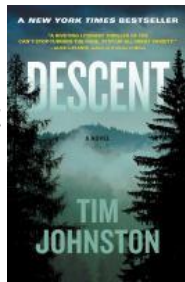
Salvation of a Saint by Keigo Higashino



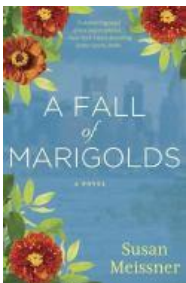

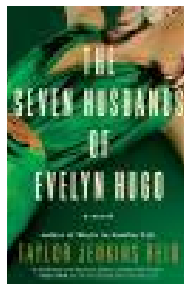
A Fall of Marigolds by Susan Meissner



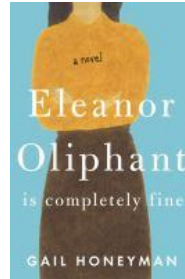

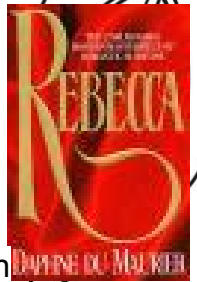
Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine by Gail Honeyman

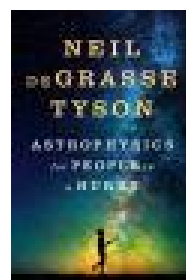

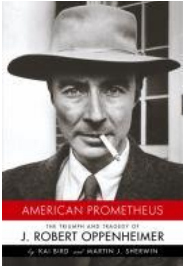

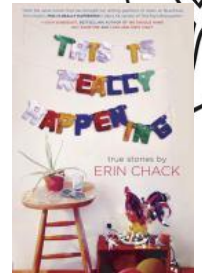


American Prometheus by Kai Bird

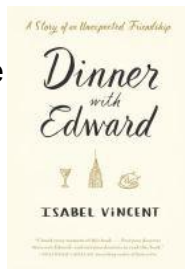
This is Really Happening by Erin Chack

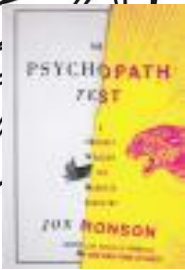
The Dead and the Gone by Susan Beth Pfeffer

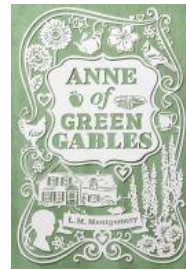
The Psychopath Test by Jon Ronson
