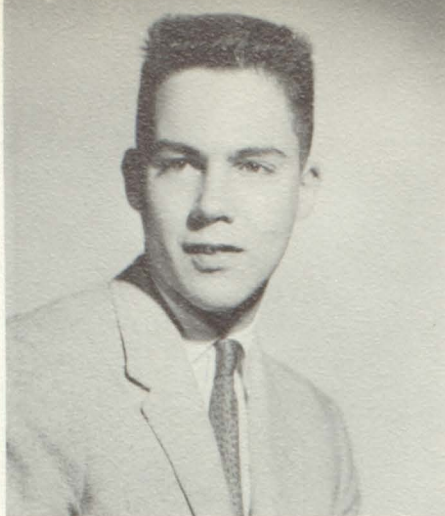
BETTE M. BECKER

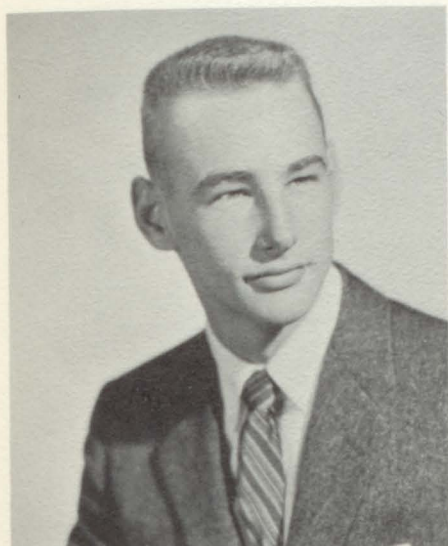

A small, friendly person with a great sense of humor, Anne is a member of the band and the Honor Society. She enjoys music, books, and movies and plans to become a teacher.



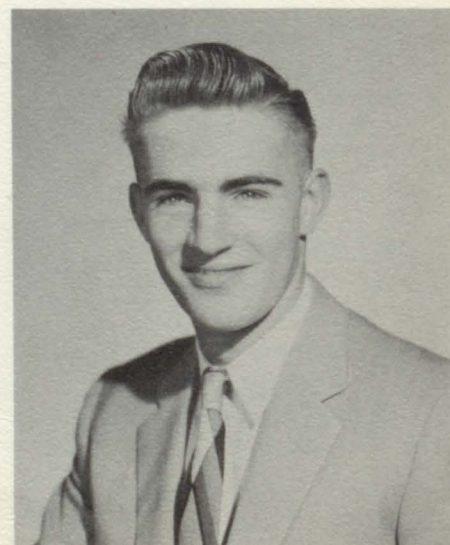

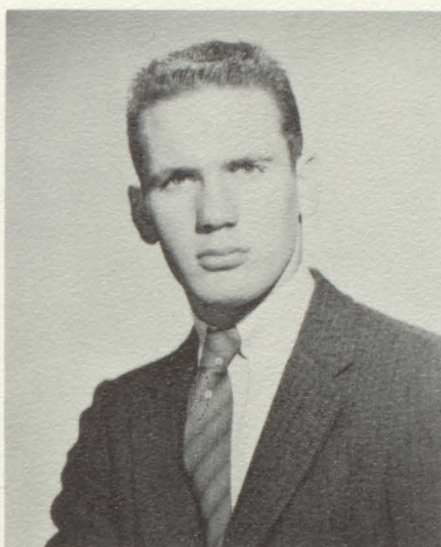


NANCY JANE COMSTOCK

Good-natured and full of fun describes Don. A member of the Bible Club, he enjoys boating, water skiing, roast beef, and pizza. College is planned for the future.



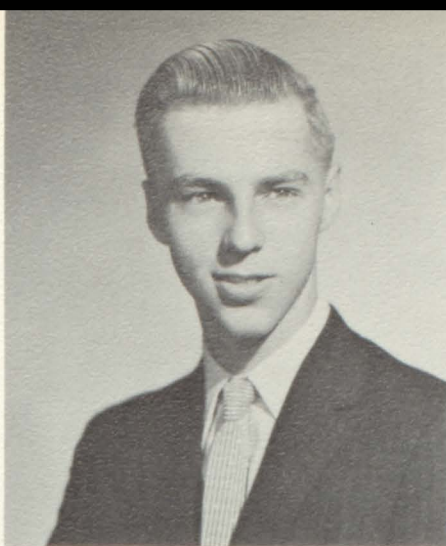
PATRICIA MAE GABRIEL

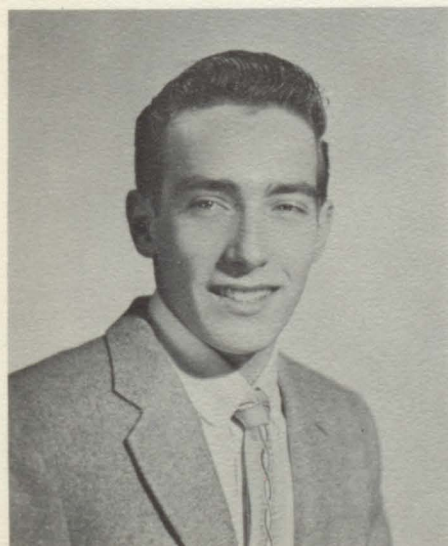


CHRISTENE HEATHER GRAY

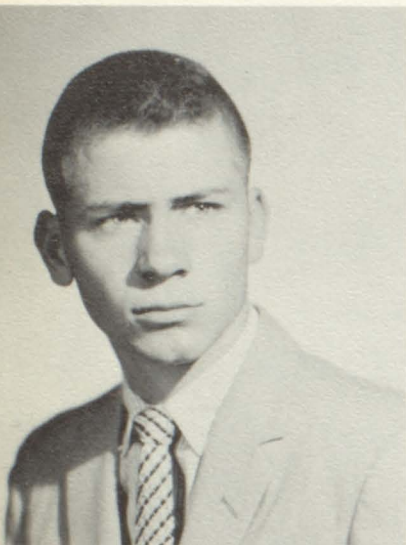
G. ALLAN HELLAWELL

**BARBARA HIEMSTRA**

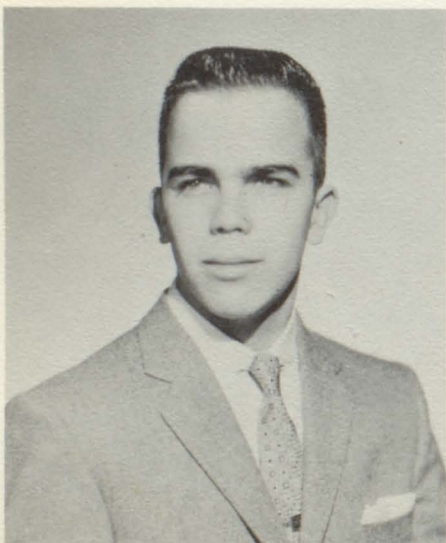

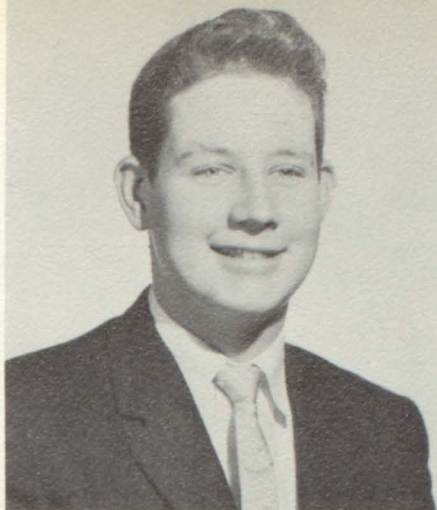
WILLIAM B. HOLBERT

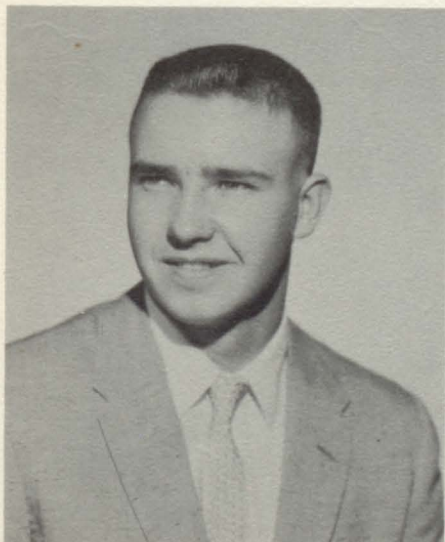


BARBARA ANN HORVATH

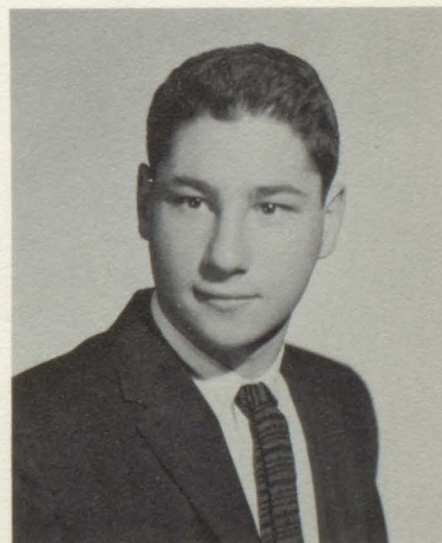
JACK W. HOYER

Much credit must be given to the **Rampage** staff for the fine job they have done in bringing us the news this year.

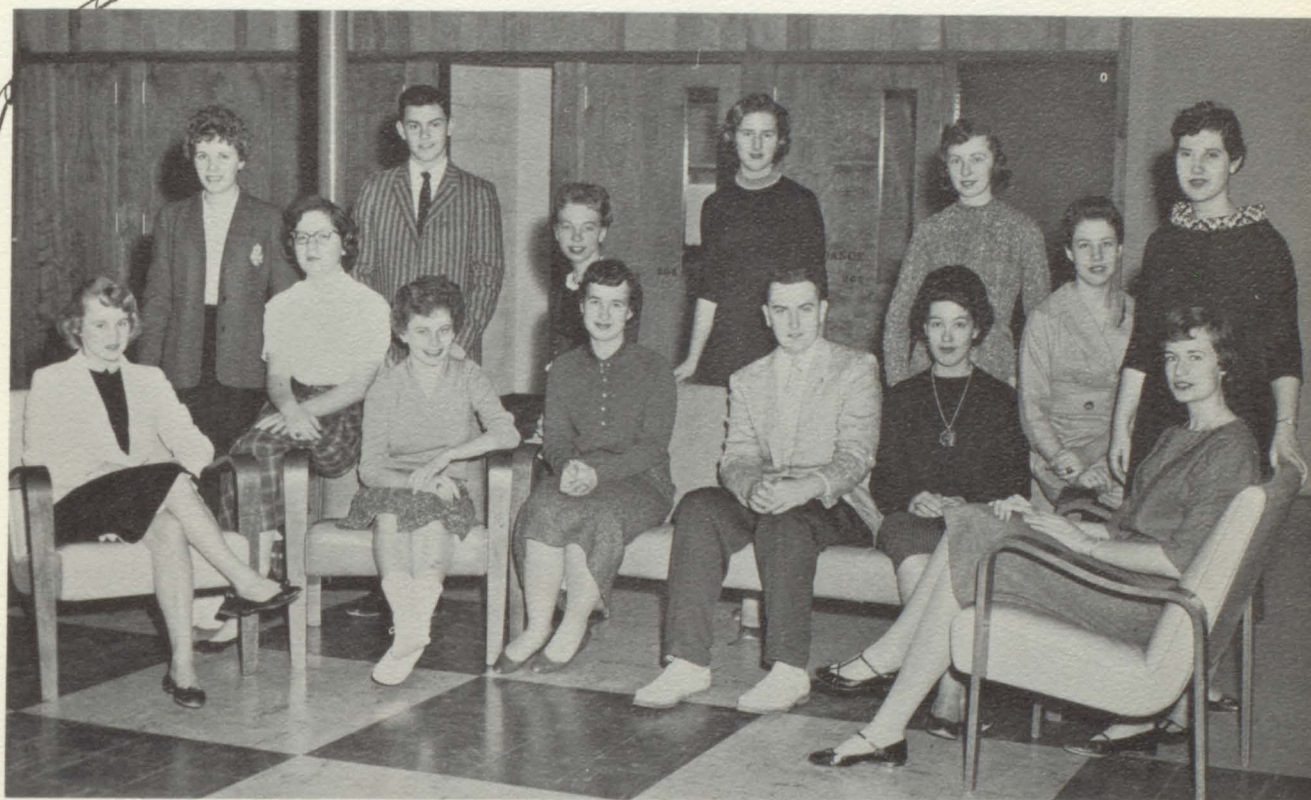
