With the audience seated on the bleachers in the gymnasium on the evenings of May 11 and 12, the Class of '63 presented Thornton Wilder's *Our Town*. Employing the talents of a sundry cast of twenty-three and innumerable members of the class as crew, this tragedy was a success, regardless of the difficulties presented by the production of a play in-the-round. ## ADVISERS

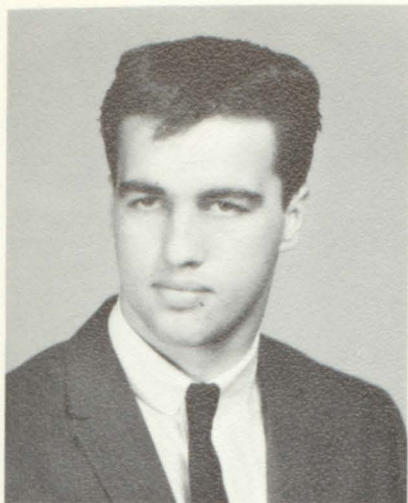

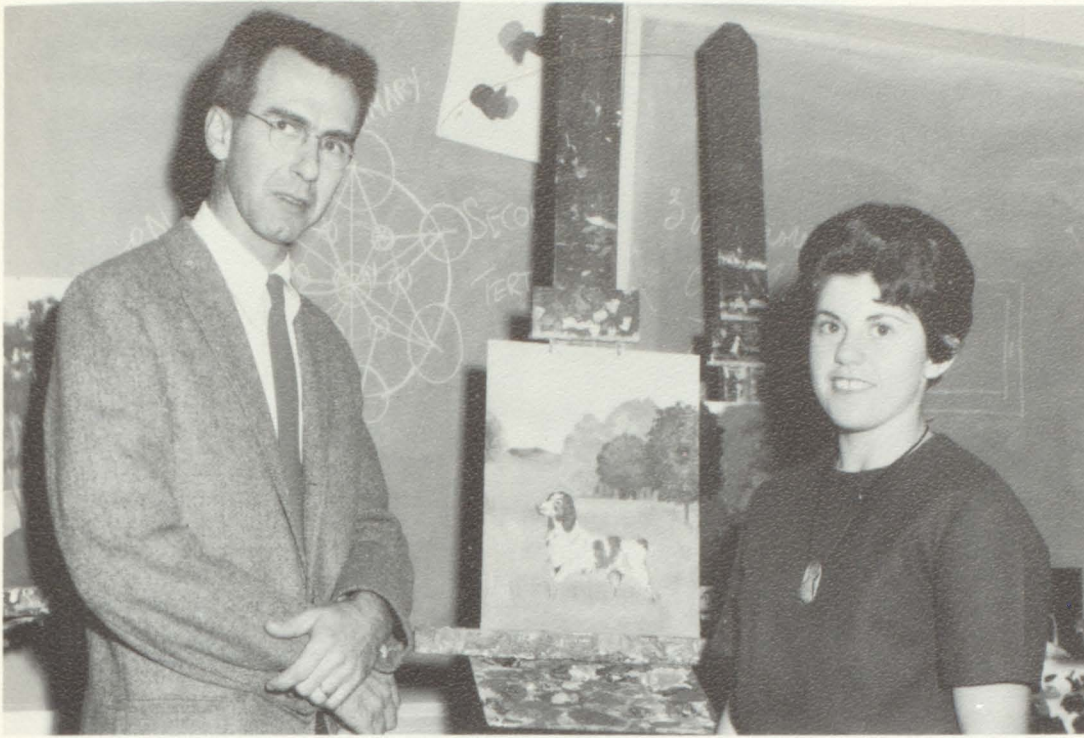

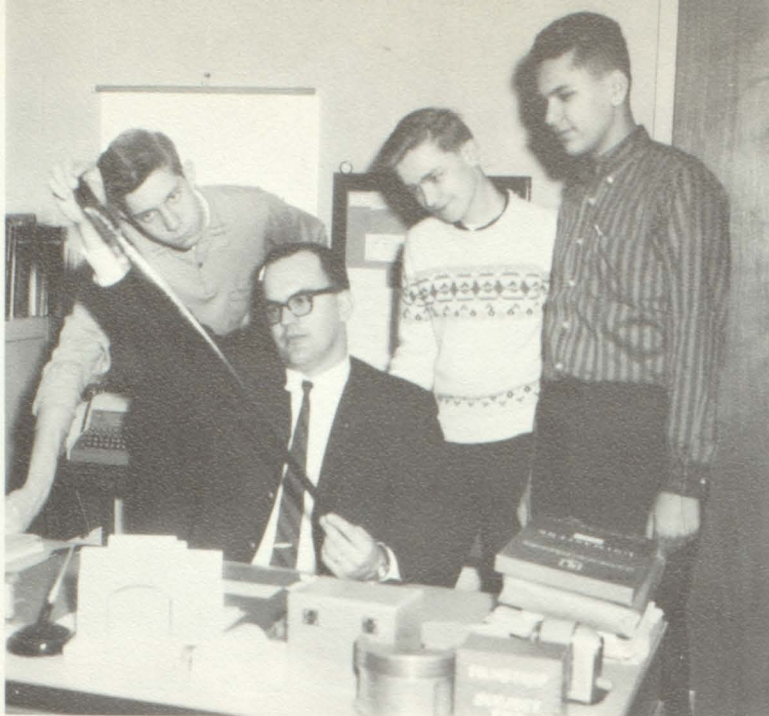
